



AVERAGE VERIFICATION FORM

The following rules apply to the 2017 USBC Senior Championships.

Average verification must be completed and returned to USBC by May 30, 2017.

Average history printed from BOWL.com also would be an acceptable average verification.

1. **USBC Rule 319a-2:** If your 2016-17 average on March 1, 2017 was 10 or more pins higher than your 2015-16 highest book average, the March 1, 2017 average must be used as your entering average for the Senior Championships.

2. **USBC Rule 319d:** If you had winnings of \$600 or more in any event in a tournament within the previous 12-month period from July 1, 2016, you must report those winnings to us. Include: name of tournament, amount of prize, actual scores bowled and prize position. Please submit on separate paper.

3. **USBC Rule 319e:** If you exceeded your entering average by 15 or more pins for 21 or more tournament games in the past 12 months from July 1, 2016 you must attach a report showing actual scores bowled and amount of money won in each tournament. Please submit on a separate paper.

4. **USBC Rule 200:** Any average established where the conditions bowled on are considered to be of a different variety than what is considered a "Standard" or "house" pattern must be reported.

5. **If you ever have had your average adjusted by any tournament or event, that average must be reported to us. This includes previous USBC Women's, Open or Senior Championships.**
