Bowling ability was his category and inducted into the Iowa Bowling Hall of Fame Posthumously.

Henry Rieder was called "Iowa's Iron Man of Bowling". He won nation-wide recognition for marathon bowling. He has bowled 51 sets of non-stop bowling of 100 games at a time, averaged 201 for 5001 games on neutral lanes against all comers. Set a record average of 221 for 100 games non-stop in Marshalltown, Iowa on March 30, 1935. Never left the lanes for any reason during any match. Bowled in 20 Iowa State Tournaments and bowled in all the scratch leagues in Dubuque until a year before his death. Bowled for 55 consecutive years and rolled three 299 games.

Henry Rieder died in 1963 at the age of 73.

Inducted into the Iowa Bowling Hall of Fame in March 1964.
