It is with great honor that we posthumously induct Brenda Stevens into the Iowa State USBC Women's Bowling Association Hall of Fame for Superior Performance on the lanes.

Brenda bowled for 20 years, both in Iowa and Nebraska holding memberships in Council Bluffs and Omaha.

She rolled five 300 games, two 299's and three 298's and her high series was an 805.

As a member of the Thunderbowl team, they captured the team championship in the Iowa State Women's tournament in 2002, 2005, 2006, 2007, and 2010. Brenda also finished in a tie for first place All Events in 2008.

Brenda served as league secretary for the Friday Nighters, the Handicap Classic and all Summer leagues at Thunderbowl in Council Bluffs. She was a director on the Council Bluffs USBC from 2006 to 2016. She was honored as the Secretary of the Year in 2005 by Council Bluffs.

While employed in the bowling industry, Brenda was instrumental in bringing the Professional Bowlers Association (P.B.A.) events back to the Omaha area.

She was employed by Thunderbowl as Assistant Manager from 1997 to 2006 and as General Manager 2006 to 2008. She was employed from 2008 to 2009 by Thunder Alley Extreme Entertainment Center in Omaha. Brenda returned to Thunderbowl as general manager in 2010 and continued in that position until she passed away on October 4, 2016.

While always making her bowling presence known in Council Bluffs and Omaha, Brenda and her team mates, Cindy Kesterson, Judy Gurney, Margo DeBar, and others, left their mark on many tournaments well outside of Council Bluffs and Omaha.
