Dave Gerst has eclipsed 50 years of bowling participation in the Greater Cedar Valley dating back to entering the junior program in 1968 as a twelve year old. Following a six year stint as a junior leaguer and the completion of his high baseball eligibility Dave debuted in 1974 as an eighteen year old averaging 164 in his first men's league competition. The road to become the bowler that he is today was not an easy one. It required much hard work, practice, equipment experimentation and an unyielding desire to become a top tier competitor.

As Dave's bowling career was rounding into shape he modeled it after three of Waterloo's premier bowlers, Iowa State Hall of Famers Rick & Fran Eighme and Joe Engelkes. In his middle ages, Dave suffered an upheaval in his personal life. He refused to let it get the better of him and used it as a motivator to become mentally tougher and apply it to his bowling game while becoming the person he is today.

Over the years he consistently has sought out tougher competition while competing in all of Waterloo's most competitive leagues. Dave has bowled regularly in as many as four leagues and currently bowls in both of Waterloo's premier leagues, (Viking and Maple Masters). In addition to winning championships in all of the Greater Cedar Valley's most competitive leagues, Dave has amassed (9) city tournament titles enroute to (3) Metro All Star 1st Team selections.

He can be found virtually every weekend as a frequent participant in Eastern lowa scratch tournaments including the Greater lowa Bowling Association (GIBA) and Senior Scratch Bowling Association (SSBA).

To say that Dave qualifies as a true sports enthusiast would be an understatement. Be it baseball, football, golf, hockey, basketball, NASCAR, stock car, English Premier League soccer and yes...... even curling..... Dave is a fan. The sport though that caught his attention at a young age and still burns brightly with a competitive passion today after 50 years is bowling. His awards and accomplishments have set him apart from his competitors and are well deserved.

## <u>Skill</u>

Dave surpassed the 200 average barrier in 1986 after 10 years in adult leagues and his game has gotten progressively stronger with every year. He consistently averages in the 225-228 range with a lifetime high of 233.

Dave's uncompromising drive to improve his skill sets have resulted in some very solid numbers.

- 800s 18. Rolled in 4-different centers with a high of 847.
  - o Most recent 800 was recorded at age 64.
- 700s 500+ and still adding to the total
  - o 1st 700 recorded 21 Sept 1979.
  - Recorded 50 700s at age 63 in the 2018/19 season.
- 300s 41. Rolled in 6 different centers.
  - O Dave has reached the 12th shot 59 times and his mental toughness shows. He has successfully executed on the 12th shot 69.4% which is far above the national norm.
  - o Includes a 300/804 rolled in the 2015 State Tournament Open Team event.
  - In the 1991 Waterloo City Tournament, Dave became the first bowler in Cedar Valley history to record (2) 300 games in one night of sanctioned competition. Dave rolled 300 in his last game of singles and moved a pair to roll 300 in his second game of doubles.

- Competing in the Quad City Senior Tournament Dave added two more titles.

- Dave is a regular competitor and consistent casher on the **Greater lowa Bowling** circuit dating back to 1986 and has qualified for three finals finishing 5\* 7\* & 8\*.
- On the Senior Scratch Bowling Circuit Dave can lay claim to 7- titles.
  - In 2016/17 season he added a 2<sup>rd</sup> & 3<sup>rd</sup> place finish

Beginning with the 1989 Wichita tournament, Dave has competed in 31 consecutive Open tournaments with #32 scheduled for Reno in Aug 2020. He takes pride in his accomplishments on the difficult scoring patterns.
