Gene Spears has been an ardent supporter of his local association along with the Iowa State Senior Bowling Committee. He served on the board of the Greater Cedar Valley USBC BA from 1999 thru 2013 before being forced to resign due to health issues. During that time, Gene represented the senior bowlers of his association with a strong voice on the local board. He worked tirelessly to support the board whenever a state open or women's tournament was held in Waterloo. In 1999, Gene was presented with the local association Director of the Year Award and was presented the Board Dedication Award in 2013.

Gene volunteered to join the local Hall of Fame Committee in 1999 and still serves on that committee currently.


In 2001, Gene was elected to the Iowa State Senior Bowling Board of Directors. He actively served on that board until health concerns forced his to retire while serving at the Vice President level. At that time, Gene was next in line to ascend to the office of President. For his dedicated service to the State Senior Board, he was awarded the Honorary President's Gavel for 2013-14.

Fortunately, Gene's health improved a few years ago and he has returned to the lanes. Over the years, he amassed a total of 3-300 games, a 297, 298, and 299. While he has won league titles and his highest average was 218, his passion and dedication to the game of bowling is where he becomes very special. As Gene's career winds down, there are three words he represents that could be used as a guide for those that follow behind him, those words would be PAY IT FORWARD.
