# Jerry Robinson

## Bowling Resume

Jerry's bowling career started in the fall of 1969 in gym class at Linn-Mar High School. His gym class visited Jubilee Lanes 3-4 times to learn how to keep score and roll the ball down the lane. He found out that he was pretty good at knocking the pins down. There were several basketball and football jocks in his class that he thought would be good at bowling. He outscored every one of them and ended up being the number one student in gym class. At that time he decided to give bowling a try.

Upon graduation in 1970, he joined a men's league at Marion Bowl. Ralph Gordon was running the center and got him interested in what it takes to be a good bowler. He was working with his Dad on a farm east of Marion milking 150-200 cows. The only time he could bowl was 8:30pm and that was the only time he bowled for the next 4 years.

He migrated to Jubilee Lanes to join 2 more leagues. This is where he started to meet his bowling friends. Jim Wheeler, George Adams, Dan Slife, and Ray Bissell. Bob Etzel was managing Jubilee Lanes at that time and asked him to work behind the desk on Wednesday nights so he could bowl in the Masters league. He witnessed some great bowlers on that night, his uncle, Harry Hazewinkel bowled and one other person that sticks in his mind was Virg Cerveney, what a smooth delivery this guy had and his scores showed this.

Working on Wednesday nights led to his wife of 34 years and counting. The former Linda Temeyer was bowling on the league before the Masters and one of his former classmates introduced the two of them and the rest is history. They married in 1979 and continued to bowl on Tuesday nights on different teams. They have two children, Michael and Mindy.

As the kids grew, so did their interest in bowling. They enrolled Mike in a league at CRBC and Mindy soon followed. Jerry became a Level 1 coach and for the next 6 years every Saturday morning, along with Edith Engel helped the 4-5 year olds. He continued to help until his work schedule took the Saturday mornings away from the kids.

For the next 5 years, Saturday night was the only night they could bowl, Jerry and Linda joined a couple's league and within one year he was elected secretary. This is when he really got interested in bowling. He felt like he was involved more and led him towards wanting to do more. He started attending the year end delegates meetings and within 2 years he was nominated to fill a director position on the board. Jerry now bowls in three leagues and is long time secretary of the Monday Night Outlaws league at CRBC and consistently has a 180 + average.

As a director he met more people who had the same desire he had to help promote bowling. He started at the bottom and every year moved up the ladder. Along the way he was chosen as the Director of the Year three times. He served on every committee and in 2006 became president. He held this position for three years then was elected a director again for three more years before being elected again to the president position in 2012 and 2013. In 2006-2007 Jerry helped me with the Charter of the Cedar Rapids USBC Bowling Association into the USBC. Assisting with writing the new by-laws, corporate papers for both federal and state and the final charter application to USBC. We also did the same for YABA the same year.

Jerry's involvement in bowling covers a lot of ground starting with his coaching the kids, then as a director on the YABA board and was elected president for 6 years. He was appointed to the Metro Bowling Council and elected president of that organization for 4 years. ~~Jerry is currently on the Iowa State Youth Board as the 3<sup>rd</sup> Vice President.~~ He also was elected in 2012 as Pin Boy of the Iowa state 700 Club along with George Adams.

Jerry has been a USBC delegate 3 times and a state delegate every year he has been on the board. He served on the tournament committee advancing to assistant tournament director and is now the current Tournament Director serving since the loss of Lawrence Studt. He has worked with other members of the board to add other things into the tournament (such as brackets and the 30 clean pot) making it a great competition for our bowlers. Jerry has directed our 50/50 raffle for scholarships and awards programs for the past 6 years to now with very good results.

His one activity outside of bowling was coaching in the Hiawatha Kids League softball and baseball and served as commissioner of that for 6 years.

Jerry's commitment to bowling is evident in everything he does. For all of this I feel Jerry is a great candidate for the Cedar Rapids Bowling Hall of Fame.
