Scott Carpenter is a lifetime resident of the Davenport/Bettendorf area other than a four year stint in the United States Air Force. Scott and his bowling expertise have long been recognized as one of the elite bowlers of our area. Scott is a Doctor of Chiropractic medicine and graduated from Palmer School of Chiropractic in 1999. He currently is a staff instructor at Palmer Chiropractic School in Davenport. He has been a junior bowling coach at Miller Time Bowling, a faculty bowling advisor and bowling coach for Palmer School of Chiropractic and a general supporter of bowling in the Quad Cities.

His bowling accomplishments are vast having accumulated twenty two 800 series with a high of 878, thirty eight 300 games, sixteen 299 games, nine 298 games and countless eleven in a row awards.

His tournament competition has also garnered him numerous titles. While in the Air Force he accomplished the following:

- 1982 World of Champions winner
- 1985 US Air Force United Kingdom Doubles Champion
- 1985 US Air Force United Kingdom scratch Singles Sweeper Champion
- 1986 Dade County All Stars Singles Champion
- 1986 South Florida Bowling Association Doubles Champion
- 1986 Qualified to bowl in the Miller Lite Classic PBA tournament at Don Carter Lanes in Miami

Having returned from service, his tournament success continued with the following:

Most importantly is Scott's success at the Iowa State Tournament where he has four Team titles (leading the team in two) and one Doubles event title with Chuck Schuette. From 1987 thru 2011 he competed in 25 consecutive USBC National tournaments compiling a cumulative average of 203, two top 10 Team finishes and two top 50 Singles finishes
