It is our pleasure to present our 47th inductee into the Iowa State USBC Women's Bowling Association, Inc. Hall of Fame. Sue could you please escort Shannon to the podium.

Shannon McHugh was recommended by the Special Awards Committee of the Iowa State USBC WBA for induction to the Hall of Fame. The Executive Board of the ISUSBCWBA unanimously approved the recommendation.

Shannon has participated in 30 Iowa state tournaments and 15 national tournaments.

She was a delegate to the Iowa State Convention from 1994 to 2002, prior to becoming a member of the State Board, and a delegate to the National Convention for five years.

Shannon is a member of the State and National 500, 600, and 700 Clubs, and the 20-Year Club. She has served as the secretary-treasurer of the Iowa 600 Club for over 12 years.

As the Greene County WBA Association Secretary for eight years, Shannon then began her administrative journey. She has been the Association Manager for seven years.

Shannon was inducted into her local Hall of Fame in 1998. She received the ISUSBCWBA Outstanding Local Association Manager Award in 2010.

Shannon joined the Iowa Women's Bowling Association In./Iowa State USBC WBA Board of Directors in 2002-2003 and has served on every committee since that time. She has been the director of the "Bowl For The Cure" tournament for ten years and is a valuable asset to the Board for all her talents and willingness to work with the bowlers making bowling more enjoyable for all.

She has designed many of the trading pins that you have seen recently and in the past. She was instrumental in designing the new logo and entry forms for the Midwest Women's Tournament to be held in Lansing, Michigan in 2013.

Shannon spends most of her time on the administrative side of bowling but also finds time to bowl. She has had a high game of 269 and a lifetime high series of 720. Her highest season ending average is 195. She has four 700 series to her credit as well as the IWBA State Tournament Division 2 All Events champion in 2002.

Celebrating her Hall of Fame induction at home, along with her Greene County bowling family, are her husband Mark, and two children Alex of Fort Dodge and Quinn of Atlantic.

Shannon is employed by the Wilcox Law Firm in Jefferson as a Legal Assistant but still finds time for all of her bowling activities and duties. The honor of being inducted into the ISUSBCWBA Hall of Fame is well deserved.
