

Adrian Erickson Memorial Scholarship



Executive Summary

This scholarship was created in honor of Adrian Erickson who devoted over 60 years of his life to the sport of bowling. Adrian started working in bowling at age 11 as a pinsetter in West Union. By age 13 he was bowling adult leagues. He continued to bowl throughout his life, including during his time in the US Marine Corp., until 2007. While he loved the sport of bowling he decided to take it to another level when purchasing the first of 5 bowling centers in 1978. He continued to be actively involved in the day-to-day operations of his centers until the day he passed away. Adrian committed his time and effort to the bowling community by serving on the local association board of directors and taking on leadership roles within the Board. This eventually extended to the State level working with the Iowa State Youth USBC Board for several years and multiple conventions across the Midwest and the United States. He supported and promoted youth bowling, high school bowling, youth tournaments, and much more. His impact was best described when he was referred to as the Godfather of Bowling in the State of Iowa. Adrian passed away May 27, 2014 at the age of 72.

Eligibility and Requirements

- Open to current USBC sanctioned youth member or eligible athlete on an Iowa High School Athletic Association Bowling Team residing in the State of Iowa,
- High school junior or senior,
- Two references: Bowling coach, teacher, or counselor,
- Essay: 500 words or less,
 - Topic: how have the lessons you have learned through bowling, academics, and community involvement influenced your life and your goals for the future?
- Unofficial transcript illustrating at least a 2.5 GPA minimum,
- Applicants can apply for both GCV level and State level however can only receive one scholarship,
- Applicants will be evaluated on essay, academic/school involvement, community service, bowling, and completed application.

Complete application and all information must be submitted together by April 20, 2020.

At least one scholarship \$500 scholarship will be awarded each year. Based on number and quality of applications, additional scholarships may be awarded. Scholarship will be awarded at the Iowa State Youth USBC Meeting in June in Cedar Rapids.

7. List other bowling involvements and honors (including years, organizations, activities, offices and special awards).

References 10%

Please include at least two letters of reference. It is recommended but not required that one reference should be from school (teacher, counselor, principal, etc.) and the other should be a bowling coach (no parent coaches). Additional letters of recommendation can be provided.

Essay 25%

Please submit an essay on the following subject: How have the lessons you have learned through bowling, academics, and community involvement influenced your life and your goals for the future? Essays should be 500 words or less. Type essay on a separate sheet of paper and include your full name on the upper right corner.
