At the last meeting of the Iowa Bowling Council, March 17 2018 – twenty three (23) \$400.00 scholarships were awarded to Iowa high school seniors for a total of \$9,200.

Iowa Bowling Council President, Randy Thompson said, “Since the inception of the Iowa Bowling Council in 1985, the Council has awarded 672 scholarships dispersing in excess of \$226,800.00.

Scholarship awards are based on a point system: up to 10 points for the application, up to 15 points for the applicant’s essay, up to 10 points for the coach’s evaluation and data sheet, and up to 15 points for the school official or counselor’s evaluation and data sheet.

Scholarship applications are distributed through: Iowa State USBC, Iowa Bowling Proprietor’s Association, and the Iowa High School Bowling Federation.

INSTRUCTION TO APPLICANT

Eligibility Rules

Any graduating high school senior is eligible to receive a scholarship, providing the student meets the following requirements:

- A. Must be a current member of USBC Youth leagues and be in good standing for the current season.
- B. Must have been a USBC member for grades 9 thru 12. **Application and scholarship is based on USCB youth league participation during high school, not on high school bowling for your high school team.**
- C. Files an application furnished by the Scholarship Fund Committee, giving complete information as required thereon, after **November 1, 2018 and no later than February 1, 2019.**
- D. Application to be filed with: **Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association, 2518 Clarkson Ave., Des Moines, IA 50310.**
- E. Has unimpaired amateur standing in the sport of bowling.

Application Procedure

- Step #1 Fill out pages 1 & 2 entirely. Please fill out as thoroughly as possible. Remember this is based on YOUTH BOWLING not high school. Please make sure applicant's signature and a Parent's signature are on the form.
- Step #2 Applicant must write and sign an essay of NO MORE than 150 words on "What has Youth Bowling Meant to Me". Example – My personal growth through youth membership or Experiences I've gained through youth bowling. **(Handwritten or typed by student – not parent).**
- Step #3 Give your league coach your essay, along with pages 1 & 2 of the application form and a stamped envelope addressed to Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association. Ask the coach to fill out Page 3 entirely. The coach should then mail the essay along with his form and pages 1 & 2 to the Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association by **February 1, 2019.**
- Step #4 Give page 4 to a school official or your school counselor along with a stamped envelope addressed to Iowa Bowling Proprietors' Association. Ask the school official or counselor to fill out page 4 and mail it by **February 1, 2019.**
- Step #5 Check with your league coach and school official or counselor by January 15 to make sure all applications papers have been mailed. Thank them for their help and cooperation.

Policies

- A. Scholarship funds may be utilized, after graduation from high school, for educational purposes at an accredited university, college or for training at approved trade schools, business schools, beauty schools, etc.
- B. Scholarship funds will be held in an escrow account until applicant is enrolled in an institution. Scholarship funds may be utilized for tuition, room board or books.
- C. Scholarship funds must be utilized completely with 18 months from date of award. Any funds remaining after this time period will revert to the general scholarship fund.
