This individual has participated in numerous lowa State and USBC Open Tournaments throughout his bowling career. He has been a participant in several Bowler of The Year tournaments, coming in second in 2011, has won numerous league championships over the years and has participated in the Quad-City Bowling Club tournaments for many years and has been on the winning team of the State 700 Club tournament. from men's bowling events this individual has qualified numerous times in Family Doubles Tournaments with his daughter and have come out on top as district winners in such events. He has also found time to do the league secretary duties for numerous years for a couple of leagues.

He has throughout his bowling years sponsored several men and women league bowling teams, numerous women's state bowling teams and youth tournaments as well as local Berlin's Mixed Double Tournaments.

This individual has helped coach youth on Saturday mornings, and Monday night High School Scratch league as well as help coach High School Bowling Team in 2011-2012 season. He is always willing to share his experience with our youths as well as helping out with equipment when the needs arise and never expecting anything in return. His ultimate goal is assist our youth in making them better bowlers and individuals.

You would think an individual who has bowled as many 300 games as our nominee has, would be used to pressure moments but when it came to witnessing his daughters first 300 game in 2012 the daddy in him took over. As his wife explained, while he witnessed every ball his daughter rolled en route to her first 300 he was a nervous wreck, especially when it came to her last ball. He attempted to step into the settee area to give some last words of encouragement but was stopped by another parent. He was shaking like a leaf and commented "I just wanted to tell her to take her time". You don't see him getting nervous like that very often, but he certainly was on that day.

This individual has accomplished the above and probably more than we have been able to research and uncover. Having said this we nominate Troy W. Payne to be inducted into the Muscatine USBC, INC Hall of Fame.
